- x Replace Trash Bins and Newspaper Receptacles Ablademic Buildings

 - o Many academic buildings do not have an accurate building map or any map which displays room numbers and helps direct visitors and students to the correct classroom or office suite.
- x TV Monitors in EarcBuilding for Recruitment
 - o Some academic buildings such as Walker Hall, Strauss Hall, and Hemphill Hall have TV monitors in the hallways entrances which show information on ULM, campus events, safety information, and other important topics. These monitors are a great informational and recruitment topic could be eplicated in every academic building across campus.



Recommendations for the Bienville Building




The Committee observed that Brown Hall is in neesconfie significant attention but is generally functional and can continue to serve the university's academic mission. Our primary








Recommendations for Caldwell Hall

x Caldwell Hall appears to be one of the most dated academic buildings on campus. We therefore recommend that the university administration give strong consideration to assessing the longerm future of Caldwell Hall in its building portfolio and whether to


- substantially renovate Caldwell Hall or determine if its key functions, such as the dental hygiene clinic, can be relocated to other buildings on campus.

Chemistry and Natural Science Building (CNSB)



Hanna Hall



Observationsof the Committee

The Committee's tour of Hanna Hall was conducted with the pending renovation of Sugar Hall partially in mind. In general, we find that Hanna Hall will require significant attention on its own merits; however, as escribed elsewhere in this report, we believe that any decisions made regarding Hanna Hall should be made in coordination with the current plans for Sugar Hall and in concert with Walker Hall. Multiple academic units utilize Hanna Hall, which has a diverse portfolio of classroom sizes for lectures and labs. Additionally, the presence of the Museum of Natural History provides a general interest attraction but limits some of the functionality of Hanna Hall. In the Committee's assessment, the Sugar/Walken/Hanorseshoe' should be developed with a combined focus to ensure synergistic capacities with a minimal amount of unnecessary redundancy. The Committee is concerned that Hanna Hall may not be compliant

Recommendations for Hanna Hall x TheCommittee believes that the Sugar/Walker/Hanna "horseshoe" has the potential to become an academic focal point on campus. Future plans for Hanna Hall should be made with those other buildings in mind; however, immediate improvements for Hanna Hall are requed regardless. x In order to maintain functionality of CNSB as an academic asset in the immediate term we recommend: 0

- o additional, easily accessible, power outlets in larger lecture halls such as Hanna 337.
- o significantly refreshing building corridors with new paint, flooring, ceiling tiles, program-specific walldecorations, building map/directory, room signsetc.

Hemphill Hall


(Minor Concerns)





- x A complete interior remodel will need to be done eventually.




- x Good space to model other academic buildings off





- x The cinderblock walls and small windows make classrooms uncomfortable. A remodel of classrooms should include fixing this issue.


Stubbs Hall




Observations of the Committee

After touring the teaching areas of the library, the Committee found the classrooms to be up to date with technological needs except for hybrid class capabilities. Also, the Committee noted the VR lab is seldom used and could be utilized more if compatient assess were allowed to be scheduled in this room. The VR equipment is out of date and needs replacing. We also noted that there is ample room available on the fifth floor to add classroom space without losing all the study space for students. The librahas 11 fully equipped study rooms as well for students to reserve. The spaces are quiet but could use a furniture upgrade to include tables and more comfortable chairs in each space. The desks in the current classroom spaces are adequate but could be uplated.

Recommendations or the University Library


- x Remove chalkboards from all classrooms.




